## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### Kia ora koutou

We have thoroughly enjoyed our first full week so we can really start getting the weekly routine going with our tamariki. Although the public holidays are welcome, the flipside of this is the stop start makes it more challenging for our kids to get their flow on.

#### Our Government's Education Policy

It has been widely publicised that every NZ school is required to teach 1 hour of Reading, Writing and Mathematics every day. I assure you that this has been and continues to be the expected teaching practice at Lynmore School. Our teachers will identify where your child is at and implement a teaching and learning programme that meets their needs.

#### Learning @ Lynmore

Our goal is to provide stimulating learning engagements for your child to NOTICE, THINK, IMITATE and INNOVATE.

- NOTICE: This stage involves actively paying attention to the world around you, noticing patterns, behaviors, and phenomena. It's about being observant and receptive to information, whether it's in the form of visual cues, verbal communication, or other sensory inputs. Observation lays the foundation for learning and understanding.
- THINK: After noticing or observing, the next step is to engage in cognitive processes such as analysis, evaluation, and synthesis. This stage involves thinking critically about what has been observed, asking questions, making connections, and forming hypotheses. It's about processing and making sense of the information gathered during the observation stage.
- IMITATE: Once you've understood or internalized something through observation and thought, imitation can be a valuable strategy for learning and skill acquisition. By imitating or emulating others who have mastered a skill or achieved success in a particular area, you can learn from their techniques, strategies, and approaches. It's a way of modeling behavior and learning through imitation before developing your own style or approach.
- INNOVATE: Innovation involves taking what you've learned through observation, thinking, and imitation and applying it in new and original ways. It's about combining existing knowledge, ideas, and techniques to generate novel solutions, products, or concepts. Innovation requires creativity, problem-solving skills, and a willingness to take risks and explore new possibilities. It's the culmination of the previous stages, where you go beyond imitation to create something truly unique and valuable.

#### Sunsmart - Rā atamai

It's pretty hot out there and we need to do what we can to keep our tamariki safe. Please sunblock your child before they leave for school and start the day by wearing a hat. We will have sunblock in classes and we will also be reminding them to wear a hat when leaving the classroom.




