Thank you to all of our senior school whanau who joined us for their child's kapahaka performance and contributed to our shared dinner to celebrate the evening's event. So what is happening at school:

Board meeting

We are bringing this a week earlier - Monday 13th May as I will be in China the following week.

Perimeter Fencing

The contractors NZ Structures are working steadily through this project and we expect this to be complete over the next few weeks. Please keep clear of any safety fencing you see around the school. This week they are working on the Te Ngae Road fencing.

Reminder: Teacher Only Day (TOD) - 4th June

The Ministry of Education granted primary and secondary schools 4 teacher only days in 2023 & 2024 to support the implementation of Te Mātaiaho (the refreshed NZ Curriculum). We are up to TOD number 3. Our school's TOD will be on Tuesday 4th June, the day after King's Birthday Public holiday. Please make alternative arrangements for your child.

International Chinese Students - Short term travel programme

We have 8 families who have put their hand up to host - we need more please.

We are pleased to be working in partnership with Silver Fern Excellence Initiative (SFEI) to foster a cultural and educational exchange between Chinese and New Zealand students.

"The SFEI short-term travel program endeavors to enhance cultural understanding between China and New Zealand, broaden the global perspectives of both Chinese and New Zealand students, and provide them with enriching experiences in New Zealand's diverse culture, natural beauty, and unique attractions. By partnering with Schools in Rotorua, we aim to offer an immersive program that will cultivate a lasting appreciation for New Zealand among Chinese students, encouraging them to consider further education opportunities in the country. Near the end of July our school will be hosting our first group of up to 30 students (appx 12 years old) from China for 9 nights, 8 days and 5 of these days the children will be attending our school. Thank you to those of you who have responded to this request. -2-

Homestay Guidelines:

- Each homestay can accommodate 1-4 students, with each bedroom accommodating 2 students of the same gender. Female students will not be placed in households with single male occupants. Homestays will provide three meals and transportation to and from school.
- Basic Accommodation Conditions: Each student will have an individual bed with clean bedding, a warm and clean living environment, free Wi-Fi access, and complimentary laundry facilities.
- Homestay families will be responsible for ensuring the safety of students during their stay.
- Catering to students' dietary needs, including preventing food allergies.
- Organize EOTC activities for students during their time at the school and ensure their safety.
- Homestay payment: \$60 per day per student
- Consent to a NZ Police Vet.

At this stage we are looking for expressions of interest to be a Homestay whanau.

On the 18th May I will be traveling to China with a NZ Principal's group to meet with our Sister School's who will be our partners in this project.



MOKOIA ISLAND...

Originally known as Te Motutapu-a-Tinirau, this island can be reached by a short boat trip from Rotorua township. Mokoia has fertile soil, and Te Arawa made good use of this to cultivate kūmara (sweet potato). The island's present name, Mokoia, alludes to the death of Arorangi at the hands of Uenukukopako, whose weapon was a kō, or digging stick. The death blow caught Arorangi across his tattooed forehead. From the words moko (tattoo) and kō (digging stick) comes the name Mokoia.
