A big shout out to the whanau, students, and teachers who hosted our international visitors over the past month. It has been an amazing learning experience for our students and staff, our homestay whanau and also our visiting students from China, and teachers from China, Korea and Japan. This is their Summer holiday hence the reason why the international visits are at this time. The next opportunity for them to visit is in early February - their Winter holiday season. I hope we will have more homestay families available to host at that time.

<u>Safety of our tamariki</u>

I know I keep going on about this and I will continue until the message gets through loud and clear. I have seen some horror scenes over the last couple of weeks:

- Coming into the staff car park, dropping off your children and then backing up or turning with near misses to other cars and children (we are now at the stage of getting a gate at the carpark entry)
- Dropping children off on the yellow lines immediately outside of school
- A child being dropped off outside of school and getting out of the back seat from the middle of the roadside. Shucks that just isn't good enough!

- Driving into house driveways to pick up your child and then backing up while children are walking on the footpath - a disaster waiting to happen.
- Larcy Road and Iles Road parking on curbs, corners and on clearly marked yellow lines

 this is not allowed in NZ
- Not using the pedestrian crossing and demonstrating to your children and others that this is o.k. Please this is not o.k.

Once again, the safety of our students, your children is paramount. Please organise to drop off and pick up your children safely. I know our tamariki are more than capable of walking into school from safe drop off points on Owhatiura Drive, Iles Road and Larcy Road, they are also capable of meeting you at those points after school. Let's do this together to keep our children safe.

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ICAS EXAMINATIONS 2024

Our ICAS examinations are nearly upon us and begin next week. Please read through to check the dates and how these exams will work.

ICAS exam dates: Maths - Thursday 29th August

<u>Time</u>: Where possible the exams will run in the first block between 9-11am. <u>Preparation</u>: It is great to see that many students have taken the opportunity to borrow practice booklets. Just a reminder that this can be returned and swapped for new booklets if this helps your child's preparation.

Additionally, we also highly recommend that students have a go at the sample tests on the demo site (<u>https://www.icasassessments.com/icas-preparation-tools</u>) for each subject they are doing. This will help them learn to navigate the types of questions that they will encounter. Students must select the correct paper for their year group:

Year 4—Paper A Year 5—Paper B Year 6—Paper C

<u>What is needed on the day</u>: Students will be provided with a school iPad that is loaded with the necessary software for the exam. Students must provide their own headphones if they are sitting the Spelling exam.

COST: \$5.00 per competitor Year 4 - 6 Boys and Girls

Rip, Grip and Whip is a fun day of mountain biking for kids of all abilities. There are three different courses to choose from catering for complete beginners to experienced mountain bikers wanting to test their skills in a race situation.

HARDBALL CRICKET (Harrow Grade)

NOW THURSDAY AFTERNOONS!

Hardball cricket is played using wooden bats and protective gear (helmets, gloves, batting pads etc), as well as a hard cricket ball. It is suited for children who have already played Incrediball Cricket or who have well-developed hand-eye coordination.

Years 4-6

Mixed teams of 8 players

Thursday afternoons from 24th October through until 12th December 2024.

Games are held mostly in Rotorua, but you may also play one game in Tokoroa depending on the draw.
