Last week, I had the opportunity to attend the New Zealand Principals' Federation (NZPF) conference. One of the most inspiring speakers was Dr. Jordan Nguyen, whose work in innovative technology truly pushes the boundaries of what's possible. He talked about how technology can drastically improve lives, from 3D-printed homes to communication tools that allow individuals with motor impairments to write text with their eyes. His ideas were nothing short of mind-blowing, and I'm eager to share some of these concepts with our students. I encourage you to take a look at some of his work online—it's both futuristic and inspiring.

Another standout speaker was Steve Francis, who emphasised the importance of leadership in schools. His message was clear: leadership isn't just about managing; it's about being proactive and organised, showing up with the right attitude, and boosting staff morale. This is something I've been reflecting on, especially as we continue to work through the challenges in education. It's important for us to remember that our attitudes are contagious. We all have a part to play in creating a positive and supportive school environment.

Our middle and senior school were treated with a presentation from Ritchie this morning. The Olympic teams values of Excellence, Respect and Resilience were demonstrated loud and clear throughout his korero. Thank you to Whaea Hayley who organised this for us.



8 years and older






