We would like to extend a big thank you to our amazing community for supporting us with the Teacher Only Day held last Friday. This dedicated time allowed our teaching team to collaborate and focus on an important area of learning: the new Mathematics Curriculum.

Unpacking the New Mathematics Curriculum

During our Teacher Only Day, we took time to explore the new Mathematics Curriculum, focusing on understanding the Why, How, and What of its implementation.

Why? We discussed the purpose behind the new curriculum statements and the design choices made. Understanding the 'why' behind these changes helps us see the bigger picture and ensures we approach the new curriculum with clarity and intent.

How? Our team delved into how we can effectively implement this curriculum in our classrooms. We explored what methods and strategies will support our students in making the most of their mathematical learning experiences.

What? Finally, we identified the key actions we need to take as educators. This includes the deliberate acts of teaching and learning that will help our students deepen their understanding of mathematics. We also explored the professional learning opportunities available for our teaching staff to ensure continuous growth in our practice.

Exciting Resources for Math Learning: Math No Problem

A key highlight of our discussions was our choice of a Ministry of Education resource, the *Math No Problem* program. We are excited about how this resource can complement the mathematics learning at Lynmore School, offering structured, engaging, and effective ways to support our students' mathematical development.

Exploring the Use of AI in Education

As part of our commitment to innovation and staying at the forefront of educational development, we are currently exploring the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in education. At this stage, our focus is on how AI can support teachers in enhancing their practice, improving efficiency, and making the teaching and learning process even more engaging.

We are looking into Al tools that can assist with things like lesson planning, assessment, and even offering personalized learning opportunities for students. We are excited to see how these technologies can complement our existing methods and provide new opportunities for both teachers and students.

Regional Kapahaka: A Time to Shine

This Saturday, we are excited to see our Lynmore School Regional Kapahaka group perform on the big stage at the Rotorua Energy Events Centre. Over the past two months, our students have worked incredibly hard, and now it is their time to shine!

A huge thank you to Matua Heke, Whaea Elizah, Whaea Lisa, and our two guitarists – Taylor and Te Rauna – for their dedication, as well as to our students and their families for their unwavering support in making this happen.

Lynmore Board Strategic Review Term 4 2024

VISION STATEMENT

We strive to inspire a lifelong passion for learning. Our approach is rooted in championing teaching excellence and providing a diverse range of learning opportunities in an engaging environment. Drawing on meaningful connections to our hauora, whenua, iwi, hapū, and whānau, we empower our students to become compassionate and well-rounded individuals.

The Board believes this vision statement represents how we approach education and community engagement at Lynmore School. Since creating this statement in January 2024, we have used it as a touchstone for all our decision making. We still think this statement is fit for purpose.

Our current Strategic Goals are still fit for purpose, here is an overview of where we are at:

Build evaluative capability to build effective leaders

Effective leadership and teaching is pivotal to student success. Professional development for all staff is personalised and on-going. Every student is able to attain the highest possible standard in educational achievement. We develop PEP's (Personalised Education Plans), in collaboration with whānau, that are unique to each tauira/student. We continue to track progress in reading, writing and maths and at our mid year review we analyse progress data of every tauira/student and allocate additional learning support where needed.

BOT REPORT...

Māori success as Māori. Whakawhanaungatanga, Whakapapa, Wairua, Manaaki

We continue to enhance our opportunities for learning and our partnerships with whānau as well as iwi and hapū. Learning experiences about Te Ao Māori are consistent throughout the school with Te Reo Māori development through kōrero, waiata, haka and ākinga. We have had 10 staff members attend Te Ahu o Te Reo Māori courses this year to support our kura/school in furthering our knowledge of Te Reo Māori.

Wellbeing for success

The school is a physically safe place for all students and staff and takes all reasonable steps to eliminate racism, stigma, bullying, and any other forms of discrimination within the school. Celebrating diversity and inclusive practice. Focusing on learner and staff wellbeing/hauora and connection to the self and each other. We do this through our PC4L (Positive Culture for Learning) philosophy.

Educationally powerful partnerships

The school is inclusive of and caters for students with differing needs. We are guided by plans, policies and local curriculum development. High aspirations for every learner/ākonga, and support these by partnering with their whānau and communities to design and deliver educational experiences that responds to their needs, and sustains their identities, languages and cultures.

BOT REPORT...

Localised curriculum

Reflects local tikanga Māori, mātauranga Māori, and Te Ao Māori. Gives effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi. We continue to cherish our relationship with local hapū, Te Roro o Te Rangi and Ngāti Whakaue. We had a successful noho marae in term 1 that provided opportunities for all tauira to be involved in kapa haka, waiata and learn karakia and explore local history and we continue this learning within the akomanga/classroom when at kura.

This Strategic Plan still aligns with the vision and values expressed by our school community at the end of 2023. It also allows us to incorporate new curriculum changes within our existing processes. We will continue to support our staff to use these strategic goals in their day to day decision making about our children's education.

The next review will be at the end of 2025 with a newly elected Board who will be responsible for creating a new strategic plan for 2026 - 2028.


Nominating a Tamariki for Kete Aroha





